




# **Confession of Sins**

# <u>Lord, Have Mercy</u>





**Epistle Lesson**.........................James 2:1-5, 8-10, 14-18

A living faith in Christ shows itself by our good works.

1 My brothers, have faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ without showing favoritism. 2 For example, suppose a man enters your worship assembly wearing gold rings and fine clothing, and a poor man also enters wearing filthy clothing. 3 If you look with favor on the man wearing fine clothing and say, "Sit here in this good place," but you tell the poor man, "Stand over there" or "Sit down here at my feet," 4 have you not made a distinction among yourselves and become judges with evil opinions? 5 Listen, my dear brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom, which he promised to those who love him?...

8 However, if you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well. 9 But if you show favoritism, you are committing a sin, since you are convicted by this law as transgressors.

10 In fact, whoever keeps the whole law but stumbles in one point has become guilty of breaking all of it...

14 What good is it, my brothers, if someone says that he has faith but has no works? Such "faith" cannot save him, can it? 15 If a brother or sister needs clothes and lacks daily food 16 and one of you tells them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but does not give them what their body needs, what good is it? 17 So also, such "faith," if it is alone and has no works, is dead. 18 But someone will say, "You have faith, and I have works." Show me your faith without works, and I will show you my faith by my works.

### Nicene Creed






# **Words of Institution**


